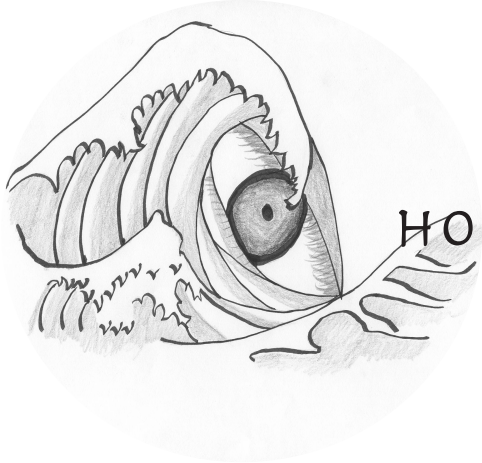

Cruise Ships By the Numbers

In one-week a cruise ship generates:

- ◆ More than 70 tons of garbage
- ◆ One million gallons of graywater (sinks, showers, swimming pools, and laundries)
- ◆ 210,000 gallons of raw sewage
- ◆ 37,000 gallons of oil-contaminated water

Most of this waste is dumped directly into the ocean, some treated, some not. Multiply these numbers by one dozen ships per day operating without regulations in Hawaii's waters and it all adds up to a real threat to our oceans.

These assaults contribute to significant degradation of water quality and precious marine resources, including coral reefs, fishing grounds, surf sites, fishes, turtles and other marine life. Our Ocean is Not a Dump!

By reporting what you observe may be the result of cruise ship activity, you will be adding your voice to the growing number of people calling for strong protection of Hawaii's oceans.

Be the Eyes of the Ocean

Surfers, paddlers, swimmers, divers, kayakers, fishers, cruise ship passengers—those of you who enjoy and care about our Ocean:

We are gathering informal documentation on the ways our ocean is being impacted by cruise ships.

- Have you seen trash, oil slicks or human waste in the ocean that you think may be associated with cruise ships?
- Have you witnessed an incident of trash being dumped overboard or effluent being released from a cruise ship?

Individuals whose documentation of dumping leads to fines against a cruise line may be eligible to receive half of any fine that is levied under the Act to Prevent Pollution from Ships. In one case, passengers videotaped plastic bags being dumped overboard. This crucial evidence led to criminal charges against the cruise line and the passengers who provided the videotape shared the \$250,000 fine.
